

The original palanguin was the dooly, which was an ordinary string bedstead, five feet by two, covered with a light bamboo frame and diaped with red curtains. From this the ornate palanquin of Calcutta and Madras was developed. First, the shape was changed to that of a hexagon. Then the sides were raised, more ornament was added and the canopy was arched. Cushions were added inside and also curtains which could completely close the palanquin if desired. The occupant reclined at full length, and was often supplied with a specially designed hookah, at which he could puff as he was borne along to business.
